International Student Financial Aid Application

Olney Friends School welcomes applications from students from all countries. We appreciate the diversity that students from other countries and other cultures bring to our school.

The ability of Olney Friends School to provide financial aid to students is limited and not guaranteed. In each case, we expect the student's family to contribute toward the expenses at Olney as much as possible and to explore every opportunity to obtain funds from local sources such as grandparents, relatives, and/or a bank loan.

Expenses other than tuition include:

- Transportation
- Travel to school and to return home in the summer
- Travel for school holidays and breaks
- Health insurance

All students must have health insurance to cover accidents and illness. The school can arrange for insurance to cover international students while they attend the school if insurance from your home country is not available. The cost for this insurance for 2012-2013 is anticipated to be about \$600. You will be billed once the student arrives and the insurance coverage is applied.

- Miscellaneous expenses

In addition to tuition, students will be charged for expenses such as instructional materials, books, test fees, and school supplies. Students will also need money for personal expenses such as clothing, laundry, and incidentals. We estimate that an average student will need \$700 for the year to cover these expenses in addition to the cost of health insurance and travel.

The International Student Financial Aid Application provides the school with information about your ability to provide funds for Olney Friends School tuition and other expenses.

When you return this signed form to the school, you must attach certified copies of all current bank and investment statements as well as a certified statement from your employer(s) of your

annual salary and bank statements for at least two years. Your application for financial aid will not be considered without this supporting documentation.
